

Sulphur Springs DOPA Training for Dairy Producers

A Dairy Outreach Program Area (DOPA) training will be offered on Tuesday, Oct. 31, 2006 at the Southwest Dairy Museum in Sulphur Springs, TX. The program will offer a morning session for producers that need to receive their initial continuing education units (CEUs) and an afternoon session for producers that have completed their initial training.
