Jobs on the Farm

Animal Handlers

Milk Harvesting Technician (milker)

Harvest the highest quality of milk through consistent procedures while caring for the health and safety of the cows.

Animal Care Technician

Make decisions and care for cows' health and well-being, administer vaccines and move cows between groups when necessary.

Maternity Technician

Assist with calves' birth and their first days of life.

Young Stock Development Technician

Feed, water and care for calves during their first two years of life.

Artificial Insemination Technician (breeder)

Identify cows to be bred and breed them.

Hoof Health Technician

Trim cows' hooves.

Rolling Equipment Operators

General Equipment Operator

Operate tractors, loaders and skid steers in various jobs that include scraping, moving feed and cleaning pens.

Feeder

Mix and provide consistent feed to livestock.

Vacuum Operator

Vacuum manure in cow pens to ensure a clean and healthy environment.

Maintenance & Repair Team

Equipment Maintenance Technician

Keep all equipment maintained and operational so that cows can be milked and the farm can function without interruption.

Facilities Maintenance Technician

Fix and maintain structural components of the farm.

Crop Management Technician

Maintain irrigation and crop facilities.

Dairy Manager

Supervise and coordinate day-to-day operations of employees for the best care of the herd.

Assistant Manager

Help the manager in day-to-day operations and employee supervision.

Parlor Manager

Maintain all parlor facilities, teach new milking technicians, and ensure the highest quality of milk is harvested from the cows.

Crop/Feed Manager

Manage crops and farm land to grow and harvest the highest quality feed in the most sustainable and efficient manner.

Bookkeeper/Accountant

Maintain the farm's financial books and statements, providing information to allow the dairy owner to make business decisions.

Office/Bookkeeping Assistant

Assist in various office tasks.
